



FLOORPLAN



CAN A NATIONAL PHARMACEUTICAL STRATEGY ACHIEVE THE PHARMACEUTICAL TRIPLE-AIM: ACCESS, AFFORDABILITY, AND APPROPRIATENESS FOR ALL CANADIANS

The World Health Organization recommends that countries coordinate their pharmaceutical policies to meet their obligation to provide universal access to safe, affordable and appropriately prescribed medicines. The case for a coordinated pharmaceutical strategy is particularly strong in Canada, where policies critically important for managing pharmaceuticals are controlled by different levels of government. INDIGENOUS HEALTH IN THE RECONCILIATION ERA TORONTO BALLROOM, CONVENTION LEVEL

The Ontario SPOR SUPPORT Unit (OSSU) was established as a partnership between the Government of Ontario and the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) to implement the national Strategy for Patient-Oriented Research (SPOR) in Ontario with an overarching goal to translate health research evidence into improved health outcomes for Canadians. Particular emphasis is placed on patient engagement in research and the generation of a strong evidence base upon which to formulate health policy and decision making. Accordingly, the aims of this session are to: Create an opportunity for trainees (Masters, PhDs and PDFs) and early career investigators conducting patient engaged POR research to network with colleagues, OSSU Centre leads and Ontario Ministry of Health and Long Term Care representatives; Promote OSSU Centre resources and the POR approach to health services research; and, Provide feedback and advice designed to further develop and advance the programs of research presented at the session.

2. TRAINING FOR IMPACT. PHD MODERNIZATION AS A KEY RESOURCE FOR LEARNING **HEALTH SYSTEMS**

CARMICHAEL ROOM, CONVENTION LEVEL

The complexity and multitude of challenges facing governments and health system organizations, coupled with the emergence of learning health systems, requires a new cadre of doctorally prepared individuals with the skills to work within the system to drive evidenceinformed improvement at all levels. Sophisticated research and analytic expertise, leadership skills, and change management experience are needed to help design, implement, evaluate and spread evidence-informed solutions and guide innovation. Doctoral training programs have an essential role to play in building this capacity, especially when done in partnership with health system organizations working to effect change. Canada's current training programs, however, were designed first and foremost to prepare graduates for traditional academic careers. Modernization of these programs is needed to expose trainees to the benefits of career paths in health system settings, equip trainees with a new set of competencies designed to prepare them for success in these complex and dynamic environments, and provide trainees with hands on experience and networking through experiential learning opportunities. AcademyHealth in the United States has been at the forefront of training modernization efforts and, inspired by their success and other similar programs taking root around the world, the Canadian Alliance for Health Services and Policy Research (CHSPRA) recently launched a Training Modernization Strategy for Health Services and Policy Research in Canada.

THE COMMONWEALTH FUND AND CANADIAN FOUNDATION FOR HEALTHCARE IMPROVEMENT (CFHI) invite promising mid-career professionals—government policymakers, academic researchers, clinical leaders, hospital and insurance managers, and journalists—from Canada to apply for a unique opportunity to spend up to 12 months in the United States as a Harkness/CFHI Fellow in Health Care Policy and Practice. Established by The Commonwealth Fund in 1925, the Harkness Fellowships were modeled after the Rhodes Scholarships and aim to produce the next generation of health policy leaders in participating countries.

Fellows are placed with mentors who are leading U.S. experts at organizations such as Harvard University, Stanford University, Kaiser Permanente, and the Institute for Healthcare Improvement to study issues relevant to The Commonwealth Fund's mission to support a high performing health care system—insurance coverage, access, and affordability; health care delivery system reforms (e.g., bundled payments, accountable care organizations, innovative approaches to care for high-need/high-cost patients); cost containment; and other critical issues on the health policy agenda in both the U.S. and their home countries. A peer-reviewed journal article or policy report for Health Ministers and other high-level policy audiences is the anticipated product of the fellowship. Harkness Fellows have published their findings in top-tier journals, including: BMJ, Health Affairs, and New England Journal of Medicine.

The Commonwealth Fund brings together the full class of fellows—from Australia, Canada, France, Germany, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, and the United Kingdom—throughout the year to participate in a series of high-level policy briefings and leadership seminars with U.S. health care leaders.

Building on their fellowship experiences, Harkness Fellows have moved into senior positions within academia, government, and health care delivery organizations, making valuable contributions to health policy and practice at home and in the United States.

EACH FELLOWSHIP WILL PROVIDE UP TO U.S. \$130,000 IN SUPPORT, which covers roundtrip airfare to the U.S., living allowance, project-related travel, travel to fellowship seminars, health insurance, and U.S. federal and state taxes. A family supplement (i.e., approximately \$60,000 for a partner and two children up to age 18) is also provided to cover airfare, living allowance, and health insurance.





Harkness Fellows as well as U.S. and international health policy experts have opened my eyes to the opportunities for us to learn from each other and to apply our knowledge to improve our own healthcare systems. My fellowship, based in Washington D.C. at the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation, provided me with an extraordinary opportunity to work with senior Administration officials and study bundled payments, one of the many innovative reform strategies being piloted in the United States. The experience gave me crucial insights into how the U.S. government implements and evaluates health policies, enriching my own research and thinking about knowledge translation of health system funding reforms.





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Twitter: How To



To create an account

- Go to http://twitter.com and find the sign up box, or go directly to https://twitter.com/signup
- Enter your full name, email address, and a password.
- Click Sign up for Twitter.
- On the next page, you can select a username (usernames are unique identifiers on Twitter) type your own or choose one Twitter has suggested. They will tell you if the username you want is available.
- **Double-check** your name, email address, password, and username.
- Click Create my account.
- Twitter will send a **confirmation email** to the address you sign up with, click the link in the email to confirm your email address and account.

Find and follow others

The next step is to find and follow other interesting Twitter accounts. Look for businesses you love, public service accounts, people you know, celebrities, or new sources that interest you. **TIP:** One great way to find accounts to follow is to see who those you admire are following. You find accounts by using the search tool.

Check Your Timeline: See what's happening

Tweets from those you follow will show up on your Twitter homepage - called your **Timeline.** New Tweets will show up every time you log on. Click links in others' Tweets to view articles, images or videos they've linked to. Click hashtagged ^ keywords to view all Tweets about that topic.

Start Tweeting!

It can be fun and exciting to contribute to your own Twitter content! When people get interested in what you are Tweeting, they may follow YOU to see what you have to say! Here are some tips to get started:



Build a Voice: Retweet, Reply, React

Use existing **Tweets** on Twitter to find your own voice and show others what you care about. **Retweet** messages that you love, or @reply with your reaction to a Tweet you find interesting.



Mention: Include Others in Your Content

When you're ready to make your own **Tweets**, consider mentioning others by using their Twitter username (preceded by the @ sign) in your **Tweets**. This will draw more eyes to your message and might even start a conversation!



Tweet Regularly

The best way to gain followers is to engage and contribute by Tweeting regularly in a meaningful way.

#Hashtag

Definition: The symbol, called a hashtag, is used to mark keywords or topics in a Tweet. It was created organically by Twitter users as a way to categorize messages.

- Tweeters use the ^ symbol before a relevant keyword or phrase (no spaces) in their Tweet.
- Clicking on a ^ work in any message shows you all other Tweets marked with that keyword.
- The ^ can be used anywhere in the Tweet beginning, middle, or end.
- Words that have a ^ become very popular and are often Trending Topics.



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
